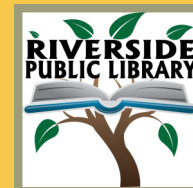

Riverside Sewer Construction

The Salt Creek Intercepting Sewer was constructed in 1927 to provide an outlet for the sewers serving parts of the 14 villages, including Riverside. After 90 years of service the interceptor must be restored. MWRD is using two trenchless methods: Cured-in-Place (CIPP) method and geopolymer liner. The Project completion date will be in November 2018.

Orion Galey, P.E., of Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd. will be speaking about the Village's existing combined sewer system, specifically as it relates to the First Division. He will also touch on the next steps the Village can take to further separate the clear (storm) water from the existing combined sewer system.

Laptops are available for use in the Library by high school aged patrons. Ask at the Information Services desk for more detail

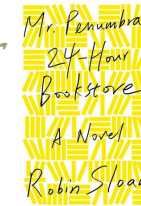
