What is a Roku?

A Roku streaming player is a device used to access online content and stream it to your TV. Millions of people use their Roku players every day to watch their favorite entertainment instantly and on demand.

What can I access with the Library's Roku players?

Now you can binge watch to your hearts content while you have the Roku player checked out. House of Cards, Orange is the New Black, Game of Thrones or O.J. Made in America are all there waiting for you to relax with some popcorn and snacks.

The Library also loads digital copies of some of their newest DVD's and Blu-Ray discs to Vudu, an online streaming service. The Library has over 350 copies available for you to watch.

How long can I check out a Roku for and what do I need?

Riverside residents 18 and over can check out a Roku player out for 1 week. The library currently has 4 players available for checkout. There are no renewals at this time. You do need to have a home Wi-Fi connection and a Riverside library card in good standing.

HDMI Cable



A/V Cable (RCA)

1. Plug it in

HDTVs: Use the HDMI Cable

Connect one end to the HDMI port on the back of your Roku player and connect the other end to an HDMI port on your TV. All Roku players come with HDMI cable capability.



Standard-Definition TVs: Use the A/V Cable

Connect one end to the A/V port on the back of your Roku player and connect the other end into your TV. *Only Roku players 1 and 2 have A/V cable capability.



Plug one end of the Power Cord into the Roku player and the other into the wall. Once you have done this a white power light on the front of the Roku player will light up.



2. Accessing your player

Power on your TV and look for a Roku message to fill the screen. If your TV does not display a Roku screen, Press the Input button (Or Source button) on your TV remote to cycle through the various video inputs available until you see a Roku screen.

3. Connect to the Internet



Follow the on screen prompts to connect to YOUR internet.

Go to:

Settings > Networks > Set up new Wi-Fi connection

Find your network and connect

4. Enjoy!

Once you have connected to your network, Click the Home button (button with the house icon) on the Roku remote to return to My Channels to start browsing and watching. If you are interested in seeing the digital films that the library has added to Vudu – on the home screen go to **“My Channels”**. Click on the **Vudu** icon. When you are in Vudu just go to the **“My Vudu”** tab and click on either **My Movies** or **My TV**. There are more than 350 titles available for you to enjoy. From **Moonlight to Moana, Fences, Arrival, Jackie, Manchester by the Sea, Trolls and Finding Dory**. Watch as many as you want while you have the Roku player checked out. Best of all - we add more all the time!
